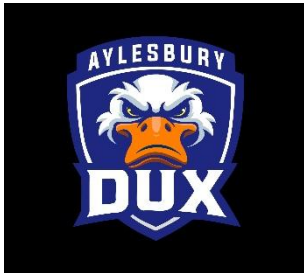

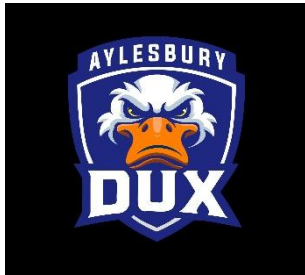

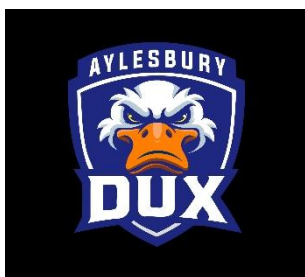

CLUB SPOTLIGHT RAVENS

“Basketball Is for Everyone” - By Simon Jackson-Turner

My name is Simon Jackson-Turner and I help to lead the Division 2 Ravens Basketball Team in the HBL. Our team has a slightly unusual origin story, and I'd love to share it in the hope that it might encourage others to take a similar path. In my mid-to-late twenties, I worked in the Neurodiversity Department of a college in Hertfordshire, supporting students with a range of neurological and physical conditions to access education. I began as a Teaching Assistant and later became a teacher. Around that same time, I had a chance encounter that changed everything. While on a school visit, I quite literally bumped into the local Special Olympics Co-ordinator. That conversation led to me coaching the East Hertfordshire Special Olympics Basketball Team — a completely unexpected opportunity.

At that point, my basketball experience was limited to casual scrimmages with friends and being a fan inspired by films and TV. I had no formal playing background. I learned as much as I could through research, watching games, and studying online resources — and yes, I completed my coaching qualifications too! Six months later, our East Hertfordshire team entered a National Tournament. By then, we had named ourselves The Ravens (a nod to my favourite TV show), and in 2014 we won gold — becoming National Champions. That experience led me to apply for the role of Team Great Britain Assistant Head Coach. In 2015, I travelled to Los Angeles for the Special Olympics World Summer Games, where we beat China in the final to become World Champions. During this period, I also stepped away from teaching and founded The Inclusion Project — a care service supporting young neurodiverse adults as they transition out of education. The focus has always been community integration, maintaining friendships, and living active, healthy lives.

Four years later, I became Head Coach for Special Olympics Team Great Britain Basketball and travelled to Abu Dhabi in 2019 for the World Summer Games. Once again, we reached the final — and this time beat the USA to become World Champions for a second time.

So where do you go from there? This is where the HBL chapter begins.

Throughout the years of preparing for major tournaments, I held weekly scrimmages with friends. The group was a genuine mix: people connected to The Inclusion Project, Special Olympics athletes, and other friends. These sessions weren't work — they were simply a group of friends playing basketball together. Neurodiverse and neurotypical players shared the court with no labels, no hierarchy — just teammates. In the build-up to the 2019 World Games, we entered the HBL under the name Blended. The idea was to give our Special Olympics athletes experience of competitive pressure in preparation for the international stage. We loved the experience so much that the following year we entered again — this time as The Ravens.

Then Covid hit, and like everyone, it took time to recover. On a somewhat impromptu decision, we re-entered the league for the 2024/25 season — and now we're back. Our current squad consists of 12 players with varying levels of basketball experience. When we originally called ourselves "Blended," it referred to blended basketball abilities — not neurological differences. Of our 12 players, three are neurodiverse and the rest are neurotypical. Of those, three had never played basketball before joining us. In fact, some of our most experienced players are our neurodiverse athletes.

From the outside, people might see us as unique because we unite neurodiverse and neurotypical players. From the inside, what makes us unique is the range of basketball experience within our squad. On a personal level, the neurodiverse element isn't something we focus on — we're simply a group of friends competing together. However, we do recognise that representation matters. If our presence shows that neurodiverse athletes — and beginners — belong in competitive leagues, then that's something we're proud of.

To the best of my knowledge (and I could be wrong), we may be the only local league team in England with this kind of mix. Whether that's true or not, we're grateful to be here.

So what has our HBL experience been like?

Honestly, incredible. Yes — we lose every game. Often by 40 points or more. But we love that other teams don't "go easy" on us. We score around 30 points a game, and we earn every single one of them. Those points are real. They matter. The adrenaline of scoring, making an assist, or watching a teammate hit a shot — there's nothing like it. Every game gives us moments we'll never forget.

Every team we've faced has been welcoming, warm and respectful. Referees and officials have been supportive and patient. It genuinely feels like, regardless of the scoreline, we leave each game having earned the respect of our opponents. Let's be honest — we get beaten most weeks. But we never stop competing. We never get frustrated. We improve a little every game, and with enough time and dedication, we believe we'll close that gap.

Our approach is simple: enjoy it. Compete fully. Be grateful to be part of the league. Have fun. We hope to become a long-standing team within the HBL and, more than anything, we hope our involvement demonstrates something important:

Basketball is for everyone. Regardless of neurological profile. Regardless of experience. Regardless of ability. Basketball is for everyone."
